What is the HELP Office?

The **HELP Office**, located at 1316 W. 4th Street in Owensboro, is a Christian agency begun by a group of churches (including Settle Memorial) in 1971. Its mission is to provide emergency assistance to the poor and to prevent duplication of services. To meet these needs, the **HELP Office** has a director who supervises a staff of over 80 volunteers. Volunteers interview clients to help determine their specific needs. A referral may be made to another agency or assistance given directly through the **HELP Office**. Funding for this office has been made possible through the generous donations of individuals, businesses and churches throughout Owensboro and Daviess County. No Government or United Way funds are used.

Please remember that food stamp allotments have been reduced and they do not cover any household cleaners or personal hygiene items.

HABITAT HOUSE UPDATE DID YOU KNOW?.....

We have collected \$13,388.15 toward our goal.

In addition to the labor, our partnership with Habitat includes Settle raising \$20,000; Habitat providing \$20,000, and a grant of \$20,000. Best of all, when the house is complete, the grant money is donated to the family and their mortgage is only \$40,000.

When do we start the Settle House with Habitat? Saturday, April 21, during Global Impact Celebration Day of kindness.

Where will the house be built? The Settle Habitat House will be the 103rd Habitat home, and will be located on Hall Street. A family is still being selected, but it will be one of the families who are currently doing their "sweat equity" hours.

When and How did Habitat for Humanity begin in Owensboro? Habitat began as a Christian ministry. Several pastors from different denominations gathered at Trinity Episcopal Church to discuss this movement. The year was 1988, and one of the motivators was Bill Moore, a retired Baptist missionary. There was organization to do, paperwork to fill out for Habitat International, officers, board and volunteers to gather, land to purchase, and a family to choose. It took a year to build the very first house for the Hoover family, not far from Settle on Bolivar Street. The house was dedicated at Christmas, 1989. (By the way, the Hoover family has paid off their home mortgage!)

Some of our members who were active in the early years of building include Clarence Reynolds, Jim Weakley, and Jim Shrewsbury. The United Methodist Conference sponsored a house early on, and then the Special Program, 7 Houses/7 Counties/7 Years, took place. Habitat and Settle have partnered many times over the years, and that makes this 2012 Habitat House very special!
